Project Swastha is an initiative taken to provide free medical healthcare for the underpriveleged. It aims to offer free medical care to underprivileged communities. The project's main motto is "bridging the gap between quality and equality."

Through setting up free health clinics in disadvantaged areas and schools, we provide eye exams, dental exams, and full physical checkups while promoting organ donation and educating on health, nutrition, and hygiene. With the support of LV Prasad Eye Institute and Hand of Hope, ophthalmologists and all necessary eye equipment are brought to the clinics, resulting in 7500 checkups, 900 glasses distributed, and 220 successful cataract surgeries in 22 camps so far. One patient even donated their eyes to the LV Prasad eye bank after passing away.

To support the project, we realized that fundraising was crucial. I have received the Nord Anglia Education Grant of \$20,000. I also raised \$6000 through various events such as basketball tournaments, bake sales, lake clean-ups, and support from family and friends. Many patients who attended our camps were unaware of their health issues. Our objective was not only to treat them but also to raise awareness of the significance of health, hygiene, and nutrition.










